### Tevis Rangers Junior High Jazz Band

The Tevis Rangers will be performing the intermission set at the April 29th Sunday Session. This will be the third time that this junior high jazz band has been featured at our monthly event. (Full disclosure: the leader of the Tevis school band, Kelly Willey, is the daughter-in-law of Fran Willey, Jubilee's Board Member and Secretary.)

The Tevis Rangers Jazz Ensemble from Bakersfield made their debut as our intermission band in May 2015. This was the first time a junior high school band had ever appeared at a BSR event. The students were all in white shirts and vests, and they looked and performed professionally. The band put on an amazing show and the response from the crowd was overwhelming. Last summer eight Tevis Rangers attended the Teagarden Jazz Camp in Pollack Pines, funded by jazz scholarships from the Basin Street Regulars. They performed so well that they were also featured at the 2017 Jazz Jubilee by the Sea.

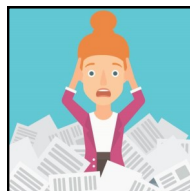
