

Featured Band: Dave Stuckey & the Hot House Gang



Dave Stuckey has been swinging his way through Los Angeles for more than a decade now, but his musical adventures as guitar player and drummer go back farther than that, through Western Swing, Rockabilly and pre-bop Jazz with The Lucky Stars, Dave Stuckey & The Hoot Owls, The Dave & Deke Combo and The Bonebrake Syncopators.

The last 10 years or so, the main dish on the menu is The Hot House Gang, a hard-charging outfit that channels an Eddie Condon small-group drive with jiving vocals that might conjure thoughts of Wingy Manone or Fats Waller. With a crack outfit (Marc

Caparone, Nate Ketner, Josh Collazo Katie Cavera and Carl Sonny Leyland) swinging the beat, a regimen of vigorous rug-cutting is always prescribed.

The OASIS Ukulele Orchestra



The Oasis Ukulele Orchestra plays weekly on Wednesday from 1-3 p.m. at the Oasis Senior Center in Old Town Orcutt (420 Soares Ave.). The Orchestra was formed in November of 2003 by Ben Tromp. Ben visited a ukulele band in Ventura, CA and was so excited that he wanted to start a band in Orcutt. Sign-ups and practice started soon after and the rest is history. The band was originally named the Oasis Play and Sing Along Society. Their first performance was a potluck dinner at the Oasis Senior Center on May 10, 2004. The group had little cards with the songs printed on them and passed them out to the audience to sing along. The band has since shortened its name to The Oasis Ukulele Band with an average of 30 people participating weekly. We have our own printed and electronic music book that is added to regularly. We offer free beginner and intermediate lessons at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesdays before our band practices. Many students from these classes have joined the Oasis Band. Past leaders include Rey Reynante and our own Tom Dutart. The band is currently mostly led by BSR member Mike Rittenhouse with help from many other band members.

The Midiri Brothers were going to be flying later and would get into Santa Barbara around 10 PM, so the Saturday show was still ago. The band finally got to Phoenix only to get stuck there. Their luggage went to Dallas. They tried to get another flight but had no luck. They were going to rent a car and drive to Los Angeles for the Sunday show. They felt so bad about missing both our shows. They sent us a note to be read at the show. It was too late to cancel the show. Rhonda said the Barrelhouse Wailers are a great band so the show must go on. The Midiri brothers did make it to the show at the Norris Center. They had to go buy clothes before the show on Sunday morning. We heard the show was awesome and that they spoke of the plane issues and how disappointed they were to miss our shows. After the Sunday show they went back to their hotel, their luggage was delivered to them at 3 AM, so they had their belongings to return home with them. On the way home they had more flight issues. Paul finally got home on Tuesday the 23rd.

Here is the note they sent us: "Joe, Jack Hegyi, Pat Mercuri, and I feel terrible about what has happened and is still not over. We are currently in Phoenix with no luggage, which is in Dallas. The plan now is to rent a car and drive to LA."

"Friday was a nightmare for us and thousands of other travelers. After three or four hours of waiting, we did get to talk to a hardworking agent who was kind enough to find the

four of us an evening flight. We were very disappointed about missing what we knew was going to be a great time with many friends, but we were hopeful about Saturday. Sitting on the plane in Philly for 90 minutes waiting for catering to put snacks on the plane was beyond frustrating. Still, we had hopes they could make up the time and we would make our connection in Phoenix. Missed

it, by ten minutes! A few more hours of waiting in line before getting our turn to be told bad news."

"Everything about Pismo has always been very special to us. The area is beautiful, the audiences are always terrific, and we get to be around some of the nicest people on the planet. This wasn't just another gig for us, more a reunion with friends. The audience and staff always make us feel that we are trying to do musically is appreciated. The music business can be difficult at best, but with friends like the ones we have in Pismo, it is certainly worthwhile. We can't express how badly we feel about what has happened this weekend. God Bless all of you!"

Rhonda asked some members to greet our guests and explain the troubles and offer refunds. Some people received refunds, but for the most part everyone was so understanding and some even made donations. Some of those that took refunds but them toward an upcoming show.

The Barrelhouse Wailers put on a great show. They jumped in and agreed to a third set so we could still have a great show. We didn't have the crowd we planned for, but everyone did have a great time.

The Barrelhouse Wailers are from Ventura. They are very talented and lively, always a lot of fun. The band is made up of 8 members. Karen Parker does the biggest share of the vocals; she looked so cute in her sheet music dress. The first set started off with, "Bei Mir Bist Du Shein." It was followed by a bunch of crowd favorites, "Louisiana Fairytale," and "What A Wonderful World." The second set was just as good with some original songs, "You Don't Know My Name,' and "Day In, Day Out." I always find it fun to see what hat and mask the tuba player will wear for each song. The third set had, "Ain't Misbehavin," and "Saint Louis Blues." The day ended with a parasol parade to, "You Are My Sunshine." Everyone went home pleased.
