Brad Lusk (vibes) and Liz Douglas (bass and vocals) from San Luis Obispo and the Central City Swing Band from the California Central Coast will be playing "Hot Swingin' Jazz" at the Basin Street Regulars' December Concert and Holiday Party from 1:00 to 4:00 on Sunday the 15th at the Pismo Beach Veteran's Building, 390 Bello Street in Pismo Beach. We will have a holiday jam session starting at 11:00 a.m.

Sonny and April Paz will cater. They have been providing delicious food at our Sunday sessions for the last few months. The menu includes Cranberry-Roasted Chicken and veggies, Butternut Squash Casserole, Rice

Pilaf, Green salad, and pies.

There are three tiers of ticket prices. Members who do not want a meal or champagne will pay \$10, non-members \$15. For all attendees that want a meal and champagne, the cost is \$25 charge this year. Silver members can attend and eat for free, but must RSVP. A champagne toast is only included with the \$25 ticket, but you can purchase champagne at the bar. You do not need to bring anything for the party but if you wish to have some snacks before lunch, please bring your own. We would appreciate it if you would patronize the bar.

Guests who are not having a meal will be asked to sit on chairs that will be set up in the right wing (the usual dance floor). The dance floor for this event will be in front of the stage,

surrounded by tables.

Central City Swing Band



Central City Swing, an amazing 17-piece big band, will perform a swinging Christmas concert on Sunday, December 15th, 2024, from 2:00–4:00 PM at the Pismo Beach Veteran's Hall. Sponsored by the Basin Street Regulars, this holiday event will feature some of the area's top musicians playing various seasonal swing and jazz music.

Central City Swing, led by Bob Swayze, was formed in 2002, drawing from professional and semi-professional musicians throughout the central coast.

"The group gathers weekly, just for fun," explains Swayze. "We sight-read charts from famous bands we admire, such as Buddy Rich, Woody Herman, Count Basie, Maynard Ferguson, etc. About four times a year, we perform concerts for the public."

Prez Says

Your Board has been struggling with a few issues lately and we want the membership to help us decide how to proceed on them.

One of our most urgent issues is the

escalating cost of the security guards at the Vet's Hall. We are mandated to hire Security Guards through the City of Pismo Beach if we are serving or selling alcohol. Prior to Covid, the City did not enforce this requirement except during Jubilee. Post-Covid, we have had to have a security guard and a city employee at all of our events when alcohol is sold. The City requirement is that we have one security guard for every 100 people. They have not required us to hire more than one, to date.

For the Pismo Vet's Hall, the City Employee and the rental fees are nonnegotiable. The total cost for the day in 2024 has been \$895, for 2025 it will increase to just under \$1000. The daily rental rate for the hall is almost \$150 higher due to the serving of alcohol. In 2025, we estimate that serving alcohol will cost us almost \$400 out of the total \$1000 for each Sunday session that we have at the Vet's. This [rental] cost, though high, is competitive with other city facilities in the area. These costs and requirements are the reasons we have been exploring other

In comparison, the Oceano Elks charge us a flat rate of \$500, and they provide the set-up and the food and beverages. We bring our own sound equipment and instruments to the hall. Ribline and Harry's do not charge us anything. We are looking at some other venues for 2025, including the San Luis Obispo Elks Lodge and the Minerva Club in Santa Maria.

It is important to note that our organization is currently financially stable due to the generous donations we have received from our members and supporters.

With all of these facts in mind, we are now asking our members to complete a survey, as part of this newsletter. You can mail it to us or bring it to the December Sunday session. We will also have copies to complete at the December Sunday session. There may also be an on-line survey option, TBD.

In The Wings

The January 26th Featured Band will be the Night Blooming Jazzmen!



The Night Blooming Jazzmen (NBJ, or "Nightbloomers") is a traditional, or dixieland band, formed in October 1975 to represent the Society for the Preservation of Dixieland Jazz at the third Sacramento Jubilee. There were very few jazz bands in existence then – not enough to put on a festival. The NBJ was started as an ad-hoc "pick-up band." It was not expected to survive - but the NBJ were so well-received and had so much fun that they stuck together. Since then, they have played thousands of concerts, church services, funerals, house parties, grand openings, jazz clubs, wedding receptions, dances, etc .. AND several dozen cruises and land trips to China, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Alaska, Hawaii, the Caribbean, the Panama Canal, the Amazon, the Mediterranean, and many other parts of Europe.

The Night Blooming Jazzmen has been one of the busiest bands in the nation – and they hope to be so again soon! They have a lot of fun with their audiences and each other – and despite this their music is top-quality. They play well and put on a great show. The band's Sunday morning "hymn-a-long" often typically has the largest attendance of any event at a festival.

The opening band will be **Tu Chez** from Santa Maria and Arroyo Grande. Tu Chez is a local four-piece combo, known on the Central Coast for their smooth, bluesy sound and fun interpretations of jazz standards. They cover

the Great American Songbook and Latin favorites with lots of fun energy and audience participation. Bodil Prescott on vocals, Chris Roullard on guitar, Geoff Moran on drums, and Terry Handy on bass. Tu Chez Jazz on the menu!



Opportunities to Serve

We could use a few volunteers for some critical tasks. The current Board has been handling these details, but it takes time away from other important jobs that they are doing and contributes to the overall overload. In particular, we are seeking volunteers for this task: **Obtaining ABC (liquor) licenses** for the Vet's Hall events

Every time we have an event at the Vet's Hall, we need to get a liquor license from the state Alcohol Beverage Control. This involves filling out two forms for the City of PB and submitting each specific show date applications along with a check to the ABC. We don't use the Vet's Hall every month, so this task is only necessary five to nine times a year.

This job will take about 20 hours of work during 2025. Curtis can train the new volunteer. The process is simple but takes a little time. Chasing signatures and replies is the most time-consuming part of the procedure.

BSR Receives 2024-2025 Senior Dancing Grant!

Our organization is truly grateful for the many years of support from the Community Foundation of San Luis Obispo County. This grant of \$10,000 helps pay for the professional musicians who share their musical talents at our monthly Sunday concerts, offering the kind of music to which our seniors love to dance!

The story of this grant goes back in time to the days of BSR musician and past president, Tom Dutart. Among his many donations of time to Seniors, Tom was also president of the Santa Maria Valley Citizen's Club. He received a call one day from a man who was charged with finding a non-profit organization to handle a million-dollar donation for senior dancing from a deceased gentleman who loved to dance. Tom kept in contact with this man who several years later said the money was available through a grant application. At that time, the Senior Club had

a band named Riptide playing for senior dances once a month. They were paid tips only. Thinking musicians deserved more than tips, Tom successfully applied for this grant of \$10,000 for the Riptide Band!

When that grant was awarded, Tom gave his copies of the application to our current BSR President Rhonda Cardinal, knowing BSR would be eligible. Rhonda applied annually beginning in 2012-2013. At that time, it was not administered by the Community Foundation. The grant had to be hand written and delivered in multiple copies.

Rhonda believes this grant was turned over to the Community Foundation in 2016 and eventually became totally available electronically. Rhonda had been applying and receiving this grant since 2012-2013. LaDean Talcott took over writing this grant in 2018-2019. All total, if our memories are correct, we have been receiving this grant for 13 years!

Last year in celebration of their official 25th Anniversary, the Community Foundation gave out \$25,000....25 grants of \$5000 each to some of their long time and most worthy recipients. BSR was one of those 25 organizations! We were awarded this special grant at a lovely reception held at the Talley home in Arroyo Grande.

Thank you, thank you, thank you! You have made many dancing seniors very happy!

2023-2024 Community Foundation Grant Report

Before retirement, they were both engineers, living in Long Beach. They worked in the aerospace industry for Boeing. German was an electronic engineer; Fran was in the field of configuration management engineering. German LOVED dancing, and when he married Fran, she was not fond of dancing. German then arranged for dance lessons with a professional teacher, and since Fran loved German, she was a good sport and learned to dance with German.

Growing up, German always wanted to be a be a musician but was discouraged by his family, since it was a most difficult way to make a living. He never lost this desire, so when they moved to this area, German looked for a group where he could play his guitar and ukulele, as well as do some dancing. BSR's monthly concerts were a perfect match.

Update on German and Fran: 2024.



This past year was a difficult one for both Fran and German. While doing yoga, Fran passed out and broke her right hip. It was a bad break and required 10

months of physical therapy. Meanwhile, German was dealing with some heart issues, until finally the doctors found the right medication.

Fran and German really missed attending the BSR monthly dances, and we all missed seeing them there. Fran was quick to

say, not only did they miss the dancing, they missed their BSR friends who have become like family. Both Fran and German commented on the good leadership of the group, the caring for all members, the fact there is no discord in the BSR membership.

As we ended our interview, both Fran and German asked that we include a thank you to the Community Foundation for helping to fund the musicians who provide the music for the dancing. It is their sincere hope this opportunity is available for young musicians and dancers

in the future.
